"For an egalitarian future in the world of Covid-19".**

This theme celebrates the unbelievable efforts made by women and girls worldwide to shape more egalitarian future and relaunch, following to the Covid-19 pandemic crisis. It also aligns with the priority theme of the 65th Commission on the Status of Women: "Women's full and effective participation and decision-making in public life, as well as the elimination of violence, for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls."

Women are on the frontline facing the Covid-19 crisis, as health professionals, care-takers, innovators, community organizers, and for some of them as national leaders, among the most exemplary and efficient in fighting against the pandemic. The crisis has highlighted the utmost importance of women's contributions and the disproportionate burden they carry.

Leading women and women organisations have shown their skills, their knowledge and their networks to lead fighting and relaunch plans efficiently against the Covid-19 crisis.

Today more than ever, everyone admits that women bring different experiences, perspectives, and skills, along with irreplaceable contributions in favour of decisions, politics and laws, that work better and benefit to all.

Most of the countries that managed to handle the Covid-19 pandemic the better, and that managed to reply to the sanitary impact and to the socio-economic consequences, are led by women. For example, the Heads of Governments of Denmark, Ethiopia, Finland, Germany Iceland, New Zealand and Slovakia were widely recognised for their quick, determined and efficient national reply to Covid-19, as well as for the compassion they showed in their factual information communication about public health.
